2021-2022 Student Ministry Internship

Student Ministry Internships at Lutheran Campus Ministry are service-learning positions designed to provide opportunities for students to:

- Experience leadership in a campus ministry environment, serving students in Christ's name
- Develop a close community of faith in which to reflect on God's presence in daily life
- Grow in relationship with God through knowledge and faith practices

The Student Ministry Internship program is a year-long commitment of approximately 10 hours per week during the academic year, excluding finals (15 weeks per semester). Each Intern will receive a stipend of \$400 per month September - May (9 months).

General Program Requirements

All Student Ministry Interns will participate in two cohort meetings per month. Meetings will take place from 1pm to 3pm on Sunday afternoons. These meetings will include three parts:

- Time for group conversation and reflection on issues and topics inspired by experiences in service sites and daily life.
- Introduction to topics related to the Christian faith including Biblical Interpretation, Lutheran Theology and Practice, and Faith in Daily Life.
- A short time for collective spiritual practices based on ancient and contemporary forms of prayer such as contemplative prayer, mindfulness meditation, lectio divina (meditation on scripture), etc.

2021-2022 Cohort Meeting Dates & Other Required Events

The cohort will meet from 1pm to 3pm on the following Sundays:

All participants are expected to participate in the fall Leadership Retreat, which will take place August 31 to September 2 at a nearby retreat center.

In addition, all Student Ministry Interns will participate in three 2-hour planning workshops per semester. These meetings will provide opportunities for interns to reflect on the work of the ministry as a whole and develop plans related to their specific areas of service.

LCM Ambassador

Mentor: Rev. Emily Tveite, Campus Pastor

Description: LCM Ambassadors are student interns who are responsible for welcoming new students to UW-Madison, connecting them to activities at LCM, and facilitating a small group each semester with the purpose of deepening connections between students.

- Facilitates a weekly small group at Lutheran Campus Ministry. In the fall this group will be dedicated to first year students. In the spring semester each intern can choose a topic of interest [2 hours per week including preparation time].
- Participates in at least one other campus ministry event per week.
- Works with the Campus Pastor to intentionally reach out to students new to LCM, conduct one on one conversations, and help newcomers connect with campus ministry activities [2 hours per week].
- Works at the front desk at LCM one evening per week [4 hours].

Qualifications: Strong verbal communications skills, comfort facilitating small group conversation on topics related to faith and spirituality, experience participating in a small group at LCM or in another faith community, a welcoming personality committed to getting to know new people.

LCM Worship Pianist

Mentor: Rev. Emily Tveite, Campus Pastor

Description: The LCM Worship Pianist provides musical leadership for an evening vespers service on a weeknight each week during the semester. In addition, the Worship Pianist helps to select music and works with other student volunteers who serve as music leaders in worship.

- Meets with the Campus Pastor weekly to create a vision for worship, plan the details of the services, and reflect on worship from the previous week [1 hour per week]
- Practices music for worship [1.5 hours per week]
- Provides instrumental leadership in worship each week [1.5 hours per week]
- Participates in at least one other LCM event each week
- Works at the LCM front desk one evening a week [4 hours per week]

Qualifications: Strong piano skills, including experience accompanying group singing; passion for Christian liturgy and interest in reflecting on local worship practices, experience leading worship preferred, familiarity with Lutheran liturgy preferred.

LCM Digital Community Intern

Mentor: Kenzie Ruiz, Communications Coordinator

Description: The Digital Community Intern is an adaptable, positive, and passionate team player dedicated to helping support and grow the digital community at Lutheran Campus Ministry. The intern will work closely with the Communication Coordinator to create and execute a digital community strategy.

- Manages social media accounts to connect current students and tell the story of current students to other audiences, including documenting LCM atmosphere and activities through photos and video, posting content and engaging with the community, seeding discussion and helping connect people, brainstorming campaign ideas, providing suggestions for improving community experiences on social platforms [3 hours per week]
- Uses internal software systems – Google, Dropbox, Asana
- Assists in creating performance reports, reviewing analytics to gauge success of campaigns
- Maintains a catalog of images on internal software system
- Participates in at least one other LCM event per week
- Works at the LCM front desk one evening a week [4 hours per week]

Qualifications: Strong interpersonal skills and writing skills, willing and comfortable with being on camera, strong communication skills and technology fluency, comfortable with Google, Facebook, and Instagram, interest in new media, good organizational skills, detail oriented and proactive.
